1300hrs - Call to Order

Washrooms in Parks

It was agreed that HEASMAN will have port-a-potties placed at Lions Park, Hydro Pond and Trout Creek Community Centre Park. They will be cleaned/sanitized once daily in in conjunction with watering flowers.

2. Community Groups/Service Clubs in Municipal Buildings

It was agreed that the Legion, TCCC hall, Trout Creek Friendship Centre, And Lion's Den at Himsworth Park should be allowed to reopen in limited capacity. TCCC hall limited to funerals, Lions meetings, TCCCB meetings. Restrictions include:

- -Maximum 50 occupants or as many as can fit to maintain 2m physical distancing,
- -all attendees must self screen before entering
- -masks shall be worn in side municipal facilities
- -operating groups shall provide the municipality with their cleaning/sanitization plan for approval.

MOUSSEAU to contact organizations to advise.

3. Health Unit Mask Directive

It was confirmed that the mandate by the Health Unit to require masks when in public indoor locations was made under Sec. 22 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act. It is not up to municipalities to enforce this. We will be requiring staff to wear masks when in common areas of the office. Buff style masks will be ordered by MOUSSEAU for staff/FD.

4. Fitness Centre

The opening of Fitness Centres will be permitted under Stage 3. We will open ours on Monday, July 20th. MARSHALL has removed some equipment from the centre and repositioned the rest to facilitate proper distancing. A limit of 10 will be placed on the fitness centre. Enhanced cleaning/sanitizing has been arranged and users will also be required to sanitize after using the equipment. Antiviral wipes have been ordered and placed in the

fitness centre. Hours will be restricted, closing at 10:30pm. Members access has been restricted to the west door to limit them from entering other parts of the building. Fitness centre administrative duties will be transferred from administrative assistant to front desk administrator. MARSHALL will draft communication for social media release.

Hummel Bridge Rehabilitation Study

ANALYSIS:

In the Spring of 2020, representative from the Municipality of Powassan, and the Township of Nipissing met to discuss the boundary roads agreement. During this meeting the condition of the Butterfield and Hummel bridges, and the preparations we can make in rehabilitating or seeking funding for the replacement of these structures; was discussed. Following the boundary roads meeting with Nipissing, the Municipality of Powassan arranged a delegation meeting with the office of the Minister of Infrastructure at OGRA's (Ontario Good Roads Association) 2020 conference. During the delegation meeting the Municipality of Powassan and Township of Nipissing discuss the state of these bridges, and asked the office of the Minister if there were any government funding opportunities for the replacement of these structures. Currently there are no funding opportunities available.

ANALYSIS:

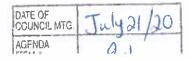
During the boundary roads meeting with the Township of Nipissing, it was estimated that a replacement/rehabilitation study for Hummel bridge would cost approximately \$20,000 (from the biennial OSIM Bridge Inspection report); as such the Municipality of Powassan budgeted \$10,000 under Capital-Bridge and Culvert for this study.

The attached report from Antoine Boucher – P.ENG on behalf of the Township of Nipissing, estimated the rehabilitation study at \$23,700 (plus HST). This study will look into the rehabilitation options to extend the lifespan of this bridge by approximately 15 years. Additionally, this study will make the Hummel bridge "Shovel Ready", and will be key in applying for future government funding opportunities.

Our boundary road agreement with the Township of Nipissing states that the Municipality of Powassan shall spilt the cost of all capital improvement on the Hemlock/Alsace boundary roads, with the Township of Nipissing. This will mean the Municipality of Powassan's portion of this study will be \$12,058.56 (with 11.24% tax rebate).

RECOMMENDATION:

That, council received this memo, the attached Township of Nipissing's memo and council resolution, and the attached report from Antoine Boucher, P.Eng.



And That , the Municipality proceed with the rehabilitation study for the Hummel bridge in the

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. THAT Council authorize the rehabilitation investigation for the Hummel Bridge;

BACKGROUND

Hummel Bridge is located on Hemlock Road some 800m south of Alsace Road and crosses the South River. The bridge value is in the order of \$1.8 Million, has a posting sign of 17T, 23T and 33T. The bridge is shared by the Municipality of Powassan, major rehabilitation and/or reconstruction costs are therefore usually shared between both Municipalities. The structure is composed of three sections, a Truss system in the center with two bridge extensions on trusses for the approaches.

The Bridge is a single lane, with an AADT of 110 based on the last evaluation completed in 2012, which is considered low traffic.

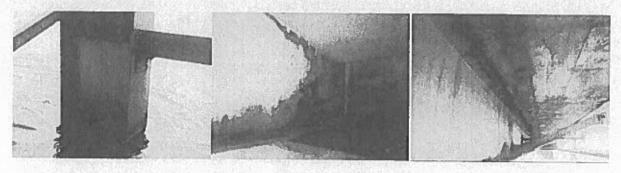
In 2019 the Nipissing Township reviewed their OSIM Bridge Inspection Study indicating the recommendation for the need to remove and replace the existing Hummel Bridge in the amount of \$2,649,000 before taxes. Staff raised questions as to the validity of the full replacement seeking the opinion as to the validity of an alternative.



ANALYSIS

Following a site inspection, it was suggested that further investigation be carried out in 2020 to better evaluate the rehabilitation of the Bridge as an alternative to a full replacement. It is anticipated that rehabilitation work may be carried out to some of the Bridge elements including but not limited to: Superstructure (steel components), curbs, wearing surface, deck soffit repairs, structural steel coating, guiderails, joints.

The investigation would first include underwater investigation using divers to evaluate the condition of the concrete piers, as the foundation and the pier steel columns and bracing system below and at the waterline. Given new MOL regulations, divers work in pairs and it is necessary to have four divers for the evaluation. It is estimated that this work can be completed in one day, however with travel their work is estimated at \$7,300 by Dundee marine.



It is proposed to oversee, provide administrative guidance and work with HP Engineering for this project. Various components will include providing divers directive in order to prepare a detailed field inspection. Gathering detailed field measurements to complete a proper analysis based on existing conditions. At this point, it is not anticipated that a 'condition survey' including concrete cores on the concrete deck be taken since it is exposed. The divers we will have a boat in order to also inspect the soffit from the river. While on site, the steel member dimensions / thicknesses will also be measured in order to properly perform a model analyze the bridge. This work will be completed for an estimate of \$4,400.

Based on the detailed data collection gathered, a final Structural Analysis will be completed to determine the existing updated load posting and also to determine it will be possible to increase / eliminate the posting for various rehabilitation options in conjunction with communication with your Public Works Road Manager and/or the Powassan Municipal Engineer. Discussions related to options such as replacing the deck with an open grating deck, timber deck, review of the strengthening of truss versus replacement, etc. will be key to the final recommendations for the selected rehabilitation measures.

Based on the selections between staff and consultant, there will be a development of the rehabilitation options and cost estimates. These options will consider the desire to potentially extend the life of the structure by 15 years; although, if a higher load rating is required, the necessary rehabilitation may by default increase this lifespan. A final presentation to Council will follow to discuss the findings of the proposed recommendation and obtain approval of the preferred alternative.

Upon obtaining Council's approval of the preferred alternative, a preliminary design report will be prepared summarizing the analysis, rehabilitation options review, preferred alternative and cost estimates. The later will be completed at an estimated cost of \$9,500. It is important to understand that this report will be key to obtaining financial assistance in the event of a funding program making the Hummel Bridge a "Shovel Ready" project.

Meeting with staff from both Municipalities, discussion regarding preferred alternatives and council presentations consists of the administrative costs related to this project and are estimated at \$2,500.

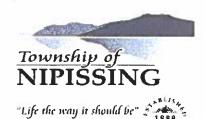
CONCLUSION

It is of our opinion that the Hummel Bridge may be rehabilitated to extend its useful life by 15 years. This will be achieved by completed a detailed analysis including underwater and focusing on which bridge elements should be replaced, reinforced or alternative measures adopted to maintain a desired posting as an alternative to full removal and reconstruction. This work is estimated at \$23,700 plus H.S.T.

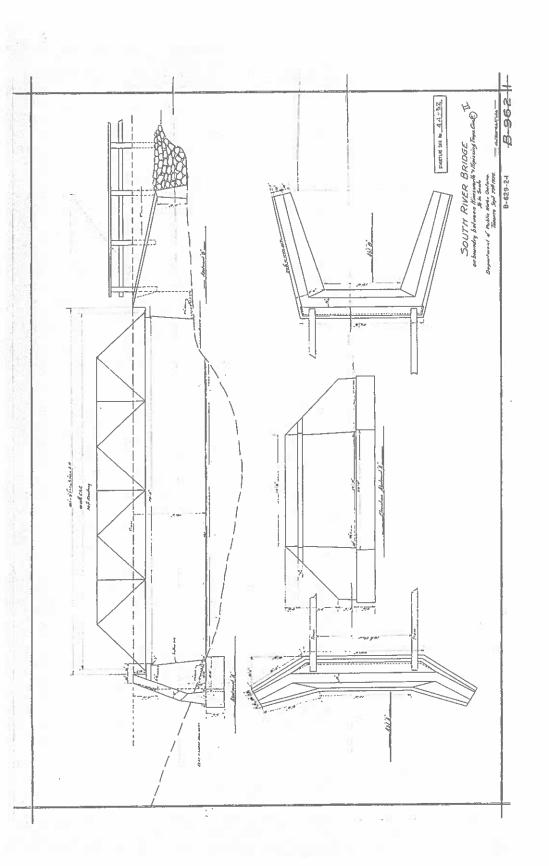

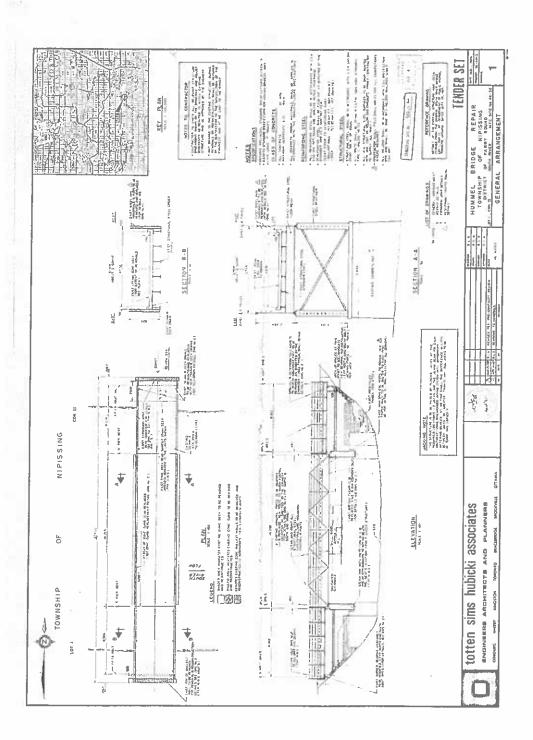

VALLEYVIEW DRIVE EAST – ROAD ALLOWANCE

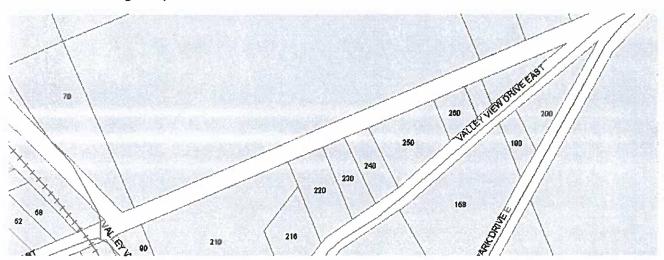
Please find attached a letter and the signatures of owners of properties on Valleyview Drive East (north side) -from Queen's Avenue to Memorial Park Drive).

Property owners are requesting Council's consideration to close up and convey the individual portions of the unopened road allowance which runs just north of their properties on Valleyview Drive East.

Our Public Works Foreman has visited the area and doesn't see any concerns with this property or with closing up and conveying.

If Council is open to this – I can look into both legal and survey costs. It would be assumed that all property owners who have expressed an interest in the sections adjacent to their current properties would be interested in moving forward on this, so that small sections of the road allowance would not be left in the municipalities' ownership and possibly landlocked.

Please see below a gis map of the road allowance area.



If Council is open to closing up and conveying the unopened road allowance - a sale value for the road allowance was also have to be determined. Sections could then be given values based upon size – for individual land owners.

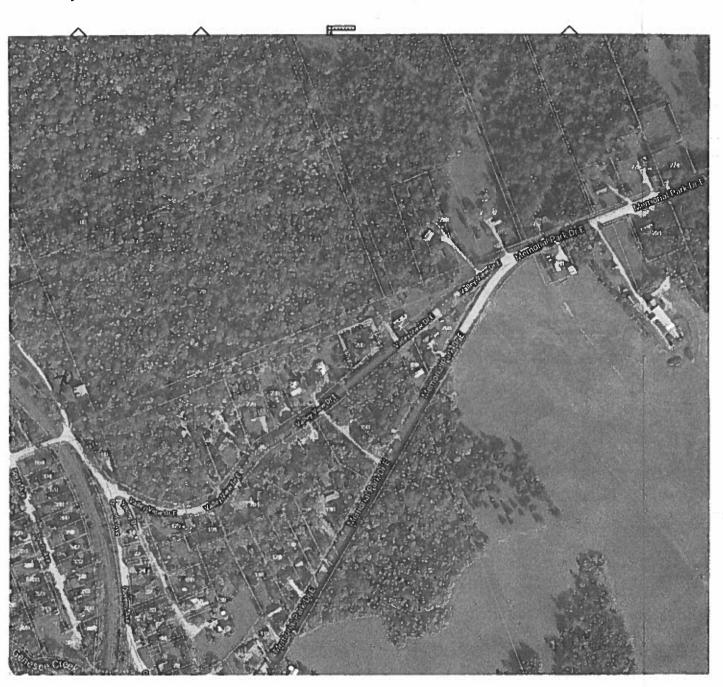

- 2. the unopened road allowance described as part of McKenzie Street, North of Corkery Street, Plan M-9, Township of South Himsworth, described as Part 1, 42R-21358, Municipality of Powassan and which is the subject matter of this by-law is within the jurisdiction of this Municipality.

PLAN OF SUBDIVISION NO LONGER TO BE LOTS IN A REGISTERED PLAN

WHEREAS Section 50(4) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 Chapter P. 13, as amended, authorizes a municipality to designate any plan of subdivision, or part thereof, that has been registered for eight years or more, as not being a registered plan of subdivision for subdivision control purposes;

AND WHEREAS a landowner in the Municipality requires two lots in a Registered Plan to no longer be lots in a Registered Plan for the purpose of merging the lots and facilitating the construction of a new dwelling;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Powassan hereby enacts as follows:

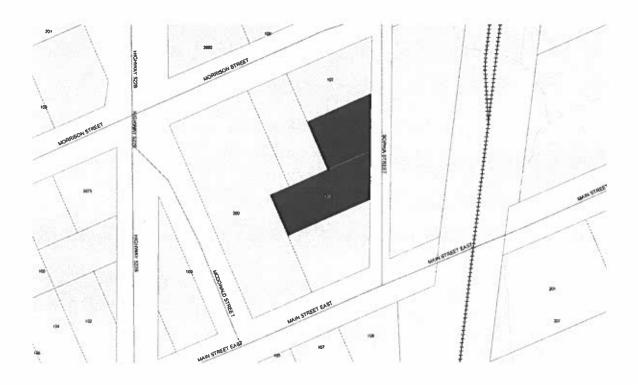
- 1. Pt Lots 1 and 2 (North Main Street) and 17 and 18 (South Morrison Street) of Registered Plan M5 shall be deemed not to be lots in a registered Plan of Subdivision in accordance with Section 50 (3) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 Chapter P. 13, as amended. (See attached schedule)
- 2. That this By-law shall come into full force and take effect on the date it is passed by Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Powassan, subject to the provisions of Section 50 (26), (27), (28) and (29) of the Planning Act.
- 3. That this By-law be registered in the Registry/Land Titles Office for the District of Parry Sound.
- 4. That the Clerk shall lodge a certified copy of this By-law with the office of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

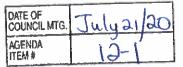

- Annual contingency test Critical Injury and Unsafe Water tested and reviewed June 30, 2020.
- Application for MDWL renewal in progress, all supporting documents compiled, just require Municipality representative signature on application form and council resolution approving financial plan.
- No Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) or Ministry of Labour (MOL) inspections were conducted this quarter.
- All required sewage samples required under the system's ECA were collected and tested in the second quarter of 2020, with one exception. See details below.
 - o Seasonal average for TSS during the spring release was 25.3 mg/L. ECA limit is 25.0 mg/L; therefore, there was an ECA exceedance which was reported to MOE SAC (Reference #5330-BQFNC3). All other parameters well within ECA limits. Operator mentioned there was daphnia in cells in this year which may have contributed to the higher than normal TSS results. Lagoons will continue to be treated with Ferric Sulphate, as necessary, prior to release. Results will continue to be monitored.

Dear Head of Council:

The COVID-19 outbreak has touched everyone in the province, creating personal and financial hardship, and resulting in losses far greater than anyone could have imagined. We are making steady progress in the safe reopening of the province, and we acknowledge and celebrate those who went above and beyond through this crisis.

I am writing to inform you that on July 8, 2020, our government introduced the COVID-19 Economic Recovery Act, 2020, to help get Ontario back on track. Our proposed bill will address three critical needs Ontario faces: restarting jobs and development; strengthening communities; and creating opportunity for people.

Our government recognizes the key role that municipalities play in restarting the economy, and that their efficient functioning and economic sustainability is critical to Ontario's future success. We are also continuing to negotiate with our federal partners to ensure communities across Ontario receive the urgent financial support they need. We know that municipalities require fair and flexible investment to protect front line services and help restart the economy.

This bill includes proposals that will enable municipal councils and local boards to meet electronically on a permanent basis and allow municipal councils to decide if they wish to have proxy voting for their members. Our government also proposes to finalize the community benefits charges framework; enhance the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing's existing zoning order authority to provide more certainty when fast tracking the development of transit oriented communities; make it faster to update and harmonize the Building Code so that we can break down interprovincial trade barriers, and permanently establish the office of the Provincial Land and Development Facilitator to help solve complex land use issues. We are also working on optimizing provincial lands and other key provincial strategic development projects that will help facilitate economic recovery efforts.

My ministry will be hosting a technical information briefing on the proposed community benefits charges framework, including proposed changes to development charges and parkland dedication, so that municipal staff can gain a better understanding of the proposal. The technical briefing will take place in the near future and invitations from the Assistant Deputy Minister of Local Government and Planning Policy Division to municipal Chief Administrative Officers, Treasurers and Chief Planners will be forthcoming.

In addition to initiatives that I have outlined above from my ministry, there are several other proposals included in our proposed legislation that will support your communities. Changes proposed will modernize our outdated environmental assessment framework, provide more local say on future landfill sites, and ensure strong environmental oversight, while supporting faster build-out of vital transport and transit infrastructure projects to support our economy. Municipally-run courts will be able to use technology to deliver services remotely and we are also moving to fill justice of the peace vacancies faster and more transparently.

We will be extending the validity period of unused marriage licences and protecting the province's most vulnerable consumers who rely on payday loans, by proposing limits on related interest rates and fees.

Also proposed is the reduction of regulatory burdens on farming while preserving the environmental rules that will support this vital part of our economy. Businesses will be able to count on clear, focused and effective rules that do not compromise people's health, safety or the environment through our changes that continue to focus on cutting red tape. At the same time, our changes will allow health and safety standards to be updated more quickly to ensure worker safety in a changing economy.

As the province continues to reopen and the economy recovers, it's more critical than ever to position Ontario as a top-tier destination for investment, domestic growth, and job creation. A key measure to support this objective is the creation of a new investment attraction agency, Invest Ontario, that will promote the province as a key investment destination and work closely with regional partners to coordinate business development activities.

Our proposed changes will also help our communities respond in part to the challenges that this outbreak has brought to our education system. Changes proposed would allow school boards to select the best candidates for director of education for their respective communities. We will also reduce red tape that is preventing access to school for some First Nation students and by limiting unproductive suspensions for our very youngest students. Students with severe learning disabilities will have an opportunity to complete their studies in the upcoming school year and by broadening the mandates of TVO and TFO, our broadcasters will be able to support students' learning needs better during these challenging times.

Through this proposed legislation, we will take the first step towards a strong restart and recovery. More information on our proposals can be found on the Legislative Assembly of Ontario's <u>website</u>.

Our greatest challenges lie ahead of us, and we know we cannot overcome them alone. It's time for everyone to play a role in rebuilding Ontario together. We will ensure no community or region is left behind. Every community must recover if all of Ontario is to grow and prosper again.

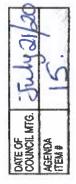
