**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Municipality of Powassan supports Blue Sky Economic Growth Corporation's application to all government Broadband funding programs including the Provincial ICON Fund, that will seek to provide funding to Spectrum Telecom Group Ltd. to build a fibre and wireless access project in parts of the City of North Bay and South/East Region in the Districts of Nipissing and Parry Sound.
