250 Clark also houses the municipal offices. Our office is open Monday to Friday from 8:30-4:30pm and we are closed on Wednesdays. The staff is available by phone Monday to Friday at 705-724-2813.



Accessibility

The Municipality of Powassan is proudly committed to promoting equal opportunity and access for all residents with disabilities to participate as fully as possible in a barrier-free community. We have completed various accessibility projects throughout the municipality to ensure safe access for anyone with disabilities. Animal Control

All residents are required to purchase a dog tag for each dog you own. Bylaw 2025-14 allows for a maximum of 3 dogs per household. Municipal dog tags carry a computer chip that can be read with any Smart-phone. Tags can be purchased at the municipal office only and must be renewed each year. Animal control services include animal enforcement and animal adoption/pound. A private contractor provides these services for the municipality. If you have concerns regarding a neighbours' pet (excessive barking, running at large, etc.) or need other animal-related services, including for predation issues, please call Sandy Briggs at 705-724-2676 or email sandy@wimberway.com.

Arena Activities

The municipality has two separate arena/community centres. Both the Powassan Sportsplex (433 Main St., Powassan) and the Trout Creek Community Centre (181 Main St., W, Trout Creek) are active centres with various programs for all residents. Each centre boasts regulation ice surfaces offering programs for adults and youth for hockey, ball hockey, figure skating, recreational skating and a host of many other special events. Building Department

A building permit is required for any construction of a building or structure, for a fireplace or wood stove and for most alterations including plumbing and electrical work. If you are unsure, please contact the Chief Building Official directly. As a general rule if it deals with structure, safety items including (but not limited to) railings, insulation, masonry or plumbing a permit is required. Sheds that are 161 square feet or 15 square metres in size or less (that do not have plumbing or electricity), do not require a permit.

Bylaw Compliance

Bylaws are enacted to maintain order, ensure public safety and to promote positive neighbourhood living. The municipality responds to written complaints regarding property standards, fence/pool enclosures, signs, noise, dumping, garbage and other matters of By-law compliance. Please visit our website to view or obtain current Bylaws. The Bylaws are administered on a written complaint basis, unless it is a health or safety issue. We try to achieve compliance without laying charges, generally beginning with a fair notice and a reasonable opportunity for corrective action to be taken. Subsequent steps could be another warning or possible legal action. 

Emergency Services



In an emergency, always call 9-1-1

In times of crisis it is easy to be upset and anxious when calling 9-1-1. Clear communication and following the prompted questions accurately and quickly will ensure a speedy response to your location. The dispatchers will guide you; be patient, take a deep breath, and answer clearly...and your emergency will be dealt with in a professional and timely fashion.

An emergency is defined as situations or impending situations caused by forces of nature, accident or an intentional act that constitutes a danger of major proportion to life and property. They affect public safety, health, welfare and property, as well as the environment and economic health of the Municipality of Powassan.

The North Bay Regional Health Centre is the local hospital and emergency room. It is located at 50 College Drive, North Bay and can be reached at 705-474-8600 or view their website at www.nbrhc.on.ca.

Emergency Management

The Municipality of Powassan Emergency Management Committee has developed an emergency response plan. Every official, municipal department and agency must be prepared to carry out assigned responsibilities in an emergency. Fire Services

The Municipality of Powassan has a 41 Member Volunteer Fire Department consisting of local residents dedicating their time to keep our community safe. Station 1 is located at 252 Clark Street in Powassan, and Station 2 at 130 Main Street, West in Trout Creek. If you require emergency fire services, please call 9-1-1.

Open Air Burning

The municipality requires anyone having an open air fire to obtain a fire permit. A fire permit for a Non Recreational (Brush) (Rural) cost is \$10.00 for a 10-day permit or \$30.00 for a 30-day permit. Flying lanterns are banned from municipality boundaries under Bylaw 2013-40. Effective April 1st every year through October 31st, day-time burning restrictions come into effect. An Annual Recreational campfire permit cost is \$30.00. Permits are available at the Municipal Office at 250 Clark Street. The charge for a deliberately set, non-permit, uncontrolled fire is \$572.00 per hour per truck dispatched. Please review Bylaw 2013-40 Open air Burning and Bylaw 2001-28 Regulate Sale and Control of Fireworks on the municipal website

Specific Restrictions:

Fire Season Period: Open Air fires shall only be permitted during the fire season. The fire season in Powassan begins on the first day of April and ends on the last day of October each year and burning is only permitted between two hours before sunset and ending two hours after sunset.

Fires in Public Places: Open Air fires are not permitted in any highway, park, walkway, public land or on any Municipally-owned lands without written permission from the Fire Chief or his/her designated official.

Fires on Non-owned Lands: No person shall set or allow a fire to burn on any land of which he or she is not the registered owner of without the written permission of the registered owner.

Restricted Fire Zones: No person shall start, permit or allow the burning of any fire during or within a Restricted Fire zone or while under a fire ban.

Forbidden Materials: The burning of industrial, agricultural or domestic waste, petroleum products, rubber, painted (or treated) lumber, mixed demolition debris, any material that will cause excessive smoke or harmful fumes, as well as any other material identified in regulations contained in the Environmental Protection Act, will not be permitted and is forbidden.

Garbage:

The Municipality of Powassan provides curbside garbage collection for all residential properties. Please place garbage bags at the end of your driveway by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. Loose items will not be collected.

Under Bylaw 2008-31, the following limits apply:

- Residential properties: maximum of 2 bags per week
- Commercial properties: maximum of 6 bags per week
- Weight limit: 40 lbs per bag

Collection Schedule:

- Tuesday Former South Himsworth area
- Wednesday Former Town of Powassan
- Thursday Former Trout Creek (including Maple Hill Road south of Hwy 534)

Garbage tags for additional bags are available for purchase at the Municipal Office for a small fee. The Municipality encourages residents to reduce waste and recycle whenever possible to help protect the environment and extend the life of the landfill. Additional weekly pick-ups are available for institutions

and businesses that require more frequent service. For details, please contact the Municipal Office at

Recycling

As of 2025, recycling collection in Powassan is managed by Emterra Environmental under Circular Materials Ontario (CMO), as part of the provincial transition to producer responsibility for blue box materials.

Recycling collection occurs every 2nd week.

Schedule updates and service notices (due to weather, vehicle issues, etc.) are posted on:

Each new household is provided with one Blue Box. Residents should sort recyclables (cardboard, paper, plastic, glass, and metal) according to the Circular Materials program guidelines. The Powassan Landfill is located at 40 Proudfoot Road, off Highway 11 between Powassan and Trout Creek. Hours of Operation:

- Wednesday and Friday: 8:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.
- Saturday: 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.
- Closed on statutory holidays

Official Plan

<u>The Planning Act</u> requires all municipalities in Ontario to adopt an Official Plan that is regularly reviewed to make sure that it remains current. Planning documents and decisions on planning applications must be consistent with the <u>Provincial Policy Statement</u>.

An Official Plan gives direction on the physical development and long term protection of services within the municipality. The Municipality of Powassan has its own Official Plan and Zoning Bylaws to regulate land use and ensure that development meets health, fire, structural and general safety requirements for the protection of the individual as well as the community as a whole. Planning Bylaws and policies ensure a better standard of growth and development of the municipality.

If you are considering any development or re-development on your property, it could be subject to a planning process and therefore, you should consult with the Planning Department early to ensure you do not experience delays.

Planning Applications include: site plan control, minor variance, zoning amendment, plans of subdivision, or Official Plan amendments. If you have any planning inquiries, please contact Deputy Clerk Kim Bester at 705-724-2813 ext 238 for further information.

Property Taxes & Assessments

Property taxes are calculated based on the assessment value of your home or business as determined by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) and the tax levy needed to meet the required municipal expenditures for the year.

At the beginning of each year Council reviews the financial position of the municipality. They also review proposed projects combined with community needs to determine the amount of revenues that must be generated to cover the expenses, as every municipality must have a balanced budget (revenues equal expenditures). Revenues are raised through user fees, planning fees, and service charges. The new Municipal Act, 2001 stipulates that most user fees must be cost recovery only. This leaves little room for a municipality to raise monies from sources other than property taxes. Therefore, property taxes are the main source of revenue for municipalities.

The total amount of tax revenue required is then divided by the total property assessments for the Municipality and thus a "tax rate" is determined. The rate is applied to the assessment value to come up with the current taxes for the ratepayer. For example, if a home is assessed at \$100,000 and the tax rate is \$.012003, the taxes for the year would be \$100,000 x .012003 which equals \$1,200.30.

If a homeowner feels his assessment is incorrect then he must submit a Request for Reconsideration Form to MPAC by March 31st each year. MPAC will review the ratepayers concerns and determine if adjustments to the assessment are necessary. A copy of any adjustment is then forwarded to the Municipality and the appropriate changes made to the taxes of that particular year.

About Your Tax Bill 19

The Municipality of Powassan taxes are payable in three installments each year. Interim tax bills are based on 50% of the previous years' taxes and are due at the end of April. Final tax bills are issued in early July with the first installment due at the end of July and the second and final installment due at the end of September, representing the final 50% payable.

The municipality offers various methods of payment for your taxes such as money orders, cheques, cash, online payments or debit transactions as well as a Pre-Authorized Payment Plan (PAPP). The Plan runs from January to December.

Road Maintenance

Routine road maintenance is performed by the municipality and all roads are inspected regularly by the Public Works Department.

Winter Road Maintenance

Plowing and salting depends on the depth of snowfall, location, temperatures, time of day, as well as other factors. Snow routes are pre-determined with higher volume roads receiving priority, including school bus routes.

Overnight street parking is prohibited from November 1st through March 31st each year so the municipal plows are able to attend to the roads at all hours and clear parking areas during non-peak hours. Vehicles may be towed if winter road maintenance is impeded.

Spring Road Maintenance

Street sweeping is carried out in the spring to remove winter sand. Commencement varies depending on weather conditions.

Water & Sewer & Septic Systems



Both municipal water and sewer services are available only within the former Town of Powassan. All residences outside of the town limits, including the Former Town of Trout Creek, are serviced by private septic systems and private wells.

For properties connected to municipal water and sewer, utility charges include a fixed rate (to support infrastructure maintenance and replacement) and a metered rate based on actual water usage. These rates apply to both residential and commercial users.

Water and sewer bills are issued four times per year, at the end of March, June, September, and December, covering each three-month billing period.

For all inquiries related to water or sewer services, billing, or maintenance, please contact the Municipal Office at 705-724-2813, and your call will be directed to the appropriate department.

Septic Systems

Residents in rural areas and Trout Creek are served by private septic systems, which treat wastewater on the property and safely release the treated effluent into the ground. Proper maintenance is essential to keep these systems functioning effectively.

The North Bay - Mattawa Conservation Authority (NBMCA) recommends that septic tanks be pumped out every 3 to 5 years, depending on household size and usage. Regular inspections and maintenance help prevent costly repairs and protect local groundwater quality.

Private Wells

Many rural homeowners rely on privately owned wells for their drinking water supply. There are three common types of wells, dug, bored, and drilled. Each requires proper care to ensure adequate water quantity and quality.

Homeowners are responsible for ensuring their well water is safe to drink. The North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit offers free basic water testing for private well owners. Water sampling bottles are available at the Municipal Office and should be returned directly to the Health Unit in North Bay for analysis.


Powassan Voodoos
